

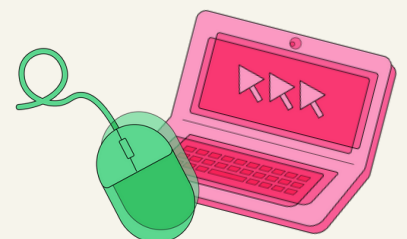
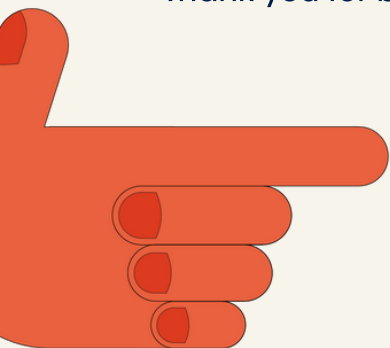
Code of Conduct

NFFTY is proud of the safe and open environment we create for our participants and audiences, and we intend to extend this throughout the Summit. Throughout each event, we expect all participants to be kind, considerate, and respectful of all Summit members, regardless of their gender identity/expression, age, physical appearance, race, sexual orientation, ethnicity, religion, and creative expression. No harassment of any kind will be tolerated during the Summit, including: verbal harassment, inappropriate online comments, hateful or derogatory language, unwanted sexual attention, stalking, or anything else that may make one feel uncomfortable within their own space. If at any point you feel that the Summit is no longer a safe place for everyone, please let us know immediately. If you see or hear unacceptable behavior, do not be afraid to speak up and tell a NFFTY staff member; we will take the necessary steps in order to prevent further issues. If you are unable to locate or identify a NFFTY staff member at the moment, please email: info@nffty.org immediately in order to get in contact with one of the team members, and we will respond as soon as possible.

No one should ever be made to feel uncomfortable at any time during these events. This includes panel members, moderators, discussion leaders, event goers, and staff members. We are dedicated to maintaining an environment of open communication, respectful discussion, and supportive creative expression. If you are asked to stop behaving in any inappropriate manner, we expect you to comply and move forward in a respectful way. If necessary, NFFTY reserves the right to remove you from any current or future events.

We believe all participants have the right to ask questions freely and to ask for clarification on any topic without shame or embarrassment. People from many backgrounds and levels of experience will be attending the Summit. When questions are asked, please do not comment/respond in a disrespectful or demeaning manner. Everyone is on a different track, and we are all here to learn. These educational environments are places where curiosity is encouraged!
